Celebration of Baptisms

There will be no celebration of Baptisms at this time.

Announcement of Easter

The season of Christmas ends with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. As the season draws to an end, the solemnity of the Epiphany offers an opportunity to proclaim the centrality of Christ's paschal mystery: dying he destroyed our death and rising he restored our life. The Easter Triduum of the Passion, death and Resurrection of Christ is the culmination of the entire liturgical year. The proclamation of the date of Easter may be announced on the solemnity of the Epiphany after the homily or after the Prayer after Communion. The Announcement with music is to be found in RM, pp. 1351-2.

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Saviour.

On the seventeenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the fourth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast o our Lord Jesus Christ. On the Sixteenth day May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-third day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the sixth day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the twenty-eight day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ,

to whom is honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

3 Bishops in 97 years

While Bishop Farrell's time in Ossory is just short of three years by comparison others were bishop of Ossory for decades. Abraham Brownrigg became bishop when Moran was transferred to Sydney in 1884 and was bishop until 1928, 44 years in all. A native of Clonegal, Co Carlow, in the Diocese of Ferns, AB (as he often signed his letters) had four uncles who were priests. He worked in the House of Missions in Enniscorthy before his translation to Ossory.

His successor Patrick Collier was bishop from 1928 to 1964, 36 years. A native of Camross he was appointed Coadjutor Bishop of Ossory in July 1928 and succeeded Brownrigg on October 1. A native of Conaghy Peter Birch was bishop for 17 years and Laurence Forristal, from Thomastown and ordained for the Archdiocese of Dublin, came in September 1981 and retired 26 years after his arrival in September 1981.

The death of Dr Birch in 1981 meant that we were just three years short of having three bishops in 100 years.

Going back to the 14th century Richard de Ledrede was bishop from 1317 to 1360, 43 years in all. Ledrede was ordained bishop at Avignon in August 1317 – the pope was in Avignon at this time. An Englishman by birth and Franciscan Friar by religious profession Kilkenny was Ledrede's episcopal city while also being the centre for disloyal members of his flock. Their leader was a rich lady named Alice Kyteler. Kyteler was married four times; her first three husbands she reputedly got rid of by poisoning and the fourth, Sir John le Poer, she supposedly deprived of his natural senses by 'philtres and incantations' so that he was totally

emaciated, deprived of his nails, without hair on his body!

In the 15th century Oliver Cantwell (1487-1527) was bishop for 40 years; he repaired the larger bridge in Irishtown which had been to a great extent broken down in the middle by the floods. A Dominican he continued to wear the habit of the Order of Preachers as bishop; he is buried in the Black Abbey.
