Holy Water Fonts

Last week we examined the holy water fonts at the entrance to the cathedral. This week we examine the two angels in Carrera marble—one in the north transept and the other in the south transept.

The two statues were sculpted by John Hogan the Younger. Hogan the Younger was a son of John Hogan who died in 1858 and he was a pupil of Benzoni in Rome. Benzoni, an Italian sculptor, is the artist of the statue of Our Lady in the Cathedral.

John Hogan was born in 1840 and died in Italy in 1920. Hogan was twenty-three years of age when he left Ireland for Rome. Six years later he returned to Ireland bringing with him works which having gained him great credit in Rome. Displaying his work in Ireland gained him great admirations and number of important commissions.

The two angels holding the fonts were given one in remembrance of John Callinan and the other in remembrance of Mrs Buckley. John Callinan was proprietor of Victoria Hotel and Callinan's Livery yard at 35 Patrick Street. He was probably grandfather of Rev E Callinan who was administrator of the Cathedral also related to Reeds of the mill on the Canan.

Mrs Buckley was probably of the family who married into the Shearman family and who occupied the house on the corner of James's Street which in subsequent years was the occupied by Tara Electric Appliances. Mrs Buckley is acknowledged as one of the sources that Canon Carrigan used when he was writing about St Mary's in his history of the diocese.

While the two angels are similar there is an interesting detail unique to each. One carries a rose while the other has a fish carved into the base of the water font.
