# Important message from An Garda Síochána Crime Prevention Unit

Gardaí are receiving an ever increasing number of complaints in relation to fraudulent and illegal scams. The scams can come in the form of texts, emails, telephone calls to your mobile or landline or even through social media. They can be difficult to spot as the correspondence claims to come from a reputable organisation such as your bank, card issuer or even a government department such as Revenue.

### **Bishops Announce a National Synod**

Acutely aware of the huge challenges to the faith over the past fifty years, appalled by the shocking revelations of institutional and clerical abuse, hearing a cry fro greater participation and accountability in the Church and the challenge to rediscover the 'Domestic Church' the National Conference of Bishops announced a National Synod in Ireland. The Synod will be an opportunity for the whole church to walk together and to navigate a map for the church as it embraces the future. It will be about 'finding the best ways for every baptized person to fulfil the Church's mission of proclaiming to the world, God's love and salvation in Jesus Christ'.

In June the bishops intend to establish a task group of lay women and men, including young people, religious, priests and bishops to plan and oversee the first steps along the synodal pathway.

# **Preparing for the Sacraments – Virtually.**

Bishop Denis Nulty invites parents and children preparing to celebrate the Sacraments later this year to a virtual gathering to explore the importance of preparing to celebrate the Sacraments. Sacramental Theologian Mgr Liam Bergin, a priest of our diocese and lecturer in Boston College, will lead parents in our parishes on a reflection of the importance of preparation, on Monday 22nd March 2021, at 7.30pm. Registration will be available on the Ossory website.

# **Bishops Appeal to Government**

The Irish bishops are calling for people to be allowed to attend public worship as soon as the country eases its COVID-19 lockdown. "We strongly believe that people's freedom to worship publicly should be restored as soon as the current Level 5 restrictions begin to be eased. It is particularly painful for Christians to be deprived, for the second year running, of the public expression of our faith during Holy Week and Easter."

Ireland's four archbishops met with Irish Prime Minister Micheál Martin on Feb. 19 to discuss the restrictions and how they have impacted on religious life and in reply Mr Martin said he would give "consideration" to the views of the archbishops and "agreed to maintain dialogue as the situation evolves."In the statement this week the bishops said, despite these assurances from the government, they "note with disappointment that none of the issues raised has been responded to." The bishops requested of the government that the easing of restrictions from Level 5 should include the restoration of public worship, "albeit in a safe and limited" manner: and that the number of mourners permitted at funeral services be increased, "with immediate effect," noting that in Northern Ireland this number has not been reduced below 25.
