
Youth 2000 Summer Festival

Going the extra mile to polish a jewel



Abraham Brownrigg 1884-1928

Patrick Francis Moran succeeded Bishop Edward Walsh in 1872 and was bishop until 1884. In 1884 he was translated to Syndey as Archbishop, to be later appointed the first cardinal of Australia in 1886.

A nephew of Cardinal Cullen of Dublin and a native of Leighlinbridge it is said that Moran had hoped to succeed his uncle in Dublin as archbishop. Meanwhile in Ossory Abraham Brownrigg was appointed as bishop in 1884 and was bishop until 1928. It could be said that Moran was more an academic than a builder Brownrigg was certainly a builder.

On Thursday April 24th, 1884, thirty five parish priests of the diocese assembled in the Cathedral to nominate a successor to Bishop Moran. Very Rev. Michael Murphy of St Patrick's College Carlow received 18 votes, Very Rev Ed McDonald received 14 votes and Rev Thomas Hennessy of Inistioge received 3 votes. The election was afterwards set aside by Rome and Very Rev Abraham Brownrigg was selected by Rome to fill the vacant see.

Brownrigg was a native of Ballypierce in the parish of Clonegall, Co Carlow. He had four uncles who were priests in the diocese of Ferns. He was ordained in Maynooth in 1861 and after a few years teaching was one of the first members of the Missionary Team of the Diocese of Ferns whose purpose was to give missions in parishes.

On arrival in Ossory he immediately called together a committee to begin work on the Cathedral. Under the direction of William Hague new marble altars were installed, a baptistery built and the Chapter House with its meeting room and sacristy erected. Within the cathedral the high altar was moved back to the wall and the reredos erected behind it. The former sacristy (beneath the high altar and accessed by a stairway) became first a mortuary chapel and then the boiler room. It is now the Blessed Sacrament Chapel.
