Bishop Laurence Forristal, a native of Thomastown, Auxiliary Bishop in Dublin was appointed Bishop of Ossory on 30th June 1981. Installed as bishop in September – no ordination because he was already a bishop – he ordained Fr Tom O'Toole in September 1981.

Going the extra mile to polish a jewel



Hyland of Clonmoran Monument

The Hylands of Clonmoran are commemorated on the wall plaque at the of the left-hand side aisle of the Cathedral. The plaque reads:

"Of your charity pray for the repose of Mr Laurence Hyland of Castleblunden who departed this life November 13th, 1845 and of his sons, Richard who departed this life June 8th, 1854 and William August 8th 1855, and his wife Eleanor who departed this life on the octave of Corpus Christi, June 3rd, 1869 to show memory this tablet has been erected. It is a holy and wholesome thought etc. R.I.P." The monument was put up by A. Colles, Kilkenny Marble Works. Eleanor Hyland was originally Eleanor Walsh from Mullinivat whose family later donated land to the Sisters of the Holy Faith for their convent. Eleanor and John Hyland's son, John Patrick Hyland, was born in 1827; he owned and rebuilt the old theatre, the Athenaeum (in 1853) on The Parade, which was the theatre in Kilkenny for over 50 years. This building is now the Citizens' Information Office. John Patrick married Elizabeth Potter, sister of Mayor M.L. Potter, in 1866 – the year of the big storm when the South Window of the Cathedral was blown out.

Note on A Colles: Colles was a very significant marble and stone worker in Kilkenny in the nineteenth century. Based in Dunbell the Colles Family worked on local stone in their workshop in Millmount Maddoxtown from 1730 to 1922 – the baptismal font in Inistioge is from their workshop. More local to Kilkenny is the very interesting water trough at the beginning of the Mayor's Walk on The Parade. Designed at two heights it allowed large and small animals to take water with ease. The doctor's surgery in Patrick's Street carries the name of Colles House remembering Dr Abraham Colles, a skilful surgeon, who is remembered particularly for his 1814 paper which defines a fracture of the wrist as a Colles' Fracture. he died on 16 November 1843 and is buried in Mount Jerome Cemetery, Dublin.
