# ON-GOING WORK IN THE CATEHDRAL

Architect Paul O'Daly, Stonemason Thomas Glendon were joined by Vincent O'Byrne of Irish Church Metals at a meeting in the Catehdral on Wednesday. A review of the design for an Aumbry took place. This special place of reservation for the Holy Oils will be placed on the pillar adjacent to where the new baptismal font will be placed. The oils the Oil of Catechumens, Oil of Chrism and Oil of the Sick are blessed each year by the bishop at the Mass of Chrism.

Seven Dedication Crosses and the six Dedication candles were also examined and removed for restoration. These crosses and candles relate to the ceremony of Dedication of the Cathedral. The architect also reviewed the area around the side altars of St Therese and the Sacred Heart. In the work of the 1970s the altar step was removed from both of these altars and some damage was done to the mosaic floor.

#### ST VALENTINE - THE IRISH CONNECTION

In 1835 an Irish Carmelite John Spratt visited Rome. His fame as a preacher had gone before him, and the elite of Rome flocked to hear him and he received many tokens of esteem from the doyens of the Church. One such token, the remains of St Valentine, were presented by Pope Gregory XVI (1831-1846). On November 10, 1836, the Reliquary containing the remains arrived in Dublin and were brought in solemn procession to Whitefriar Street Church where they were received by Archbishop Murray of Dublin. With the death of Fr Spratt interest in the relics died away and they went into storage. During a major renovation in the church in the 1950s/60s they were returned to prominence with an altar and shrine being constructed to house them and enable them to be venerated. The statue was carved by Irene Broe and depicts the saint in the red vestments of a martyr and holding a crocus in his hand. Today, the Shrine is visited throughout the year by couples who come to pray to St Valentine and to ask him to watch over them in their lives together.
