5TH MARCH 1965- ST KIERAN'S DAY

On the 5th March 1965, the Feast of St Kieran, the first mass with the priest facing the people was celebrated in St Mary's Cathedral. Bishop Birch presided at the Solemn High Mass. The Kilkenny People carried the news on the front page of the paper the following week with a photograph showing a temporary altar that was erected under the tower.

The paper reported:

"Mass, with the priest facing the congregation, was celebrated for the first time in the Diocese of Ossory on a temporary altar on the main aisle beneath the tower in St Mary's Cathedral on Friday, the Feast of St Kieran. His Lordship, Most Rev. Dr. Birch, Bishop of Ossory, presided at the Solemn High Mass, and the celebrant was Rev T. O'Connor, Dean, St Kieran's College; deacon Rev S Doherty, Sub-Deacon, Rev P Malone, master of ceremonies, Rev P Duggan."

The Kilkenny People published a photo of the celebration in the Cathedral and there is a copy in the diocesan archives.

The mass was still in Latin; it was a number of years before the English texts became available and it took a further 10 years before the official English Text were approved and were in widespread use.
