MARY – THE FIRST DISCIPLE - OUR MODEL IN FAITH

Mary met the requirements of discipleship in an outstanding way. There is one thought running through the New Testament: while Mary is the mother of God's Son, she is first and foremost a disciple, not in the historical sense that she accompanied Jesus during his ministry, but in the sense that Mary above all others is the one who heard the Word of God and acted trustingly upon it. Mary's faithfulness and trust in God's Word runs right through from the Annunciation to the coming of the Holy Spirit in the Acts of the Apostles after the Resurrection.

Like Mary, our life stories are also touched by events which we cannot understand. Sometimes it is only in looking back that we can see God's presence in these events. Mary's story is close to our story. Mary is blessed not simply because she gave birth to a child, the Son of God. She is blessed because she **heard**, **believed**, **obeyed**, **kept**, **pondered the Word**, **and continued** to act on it. Mary is truly our model in faith.

THE BELLS OF ST MARY'S – PART 2

There are two dome bells which were used at mass within the cathedral. They are inscribed with their donors' names. Firstly, a cast brass bell is dated 1867 and the inscription reads:

To God's temple from Dr and Mrs Duigan in gratitude for a novena heard 1867

Daniel J Duigan MD RN was married to Margaret Cavanagh by Most Rev Edward Walsh, Bishop of Ossory on 21st August 1857. The wedding took place in the 'Old Cathedral' as the present building was only opened on the 4th October 1857 (the second last wedding in the Old Cathedral). There is a medal (The Italian Gallantry medal for oriental campaign) inscribed '*Daniel J Duigan, MD Naval Brigade (1855-1856)*' in the British Science Museum, Kensington, London.

Dr Duigan's name also appears on the inscription on the base of the holy water fonts at the front door of the cathedral. Bassett's *Kilkenny City and County* (1884) describes the two Holy Water Fonts at the entrance door: "At the main entrance are two mammoth ocean shells, the gift of Naval Surgeon Daniel J Duigan, 1877. They are mounted on blocks of polished white marble and serve admirably the purposes of holy water fonts" (page 41). Perhaps Duigan acquired these shells on one of his journeys out east. Margaret Phelan (St Mary's Cathedral Kilkenny, 1972) notes that the two ocean shells are now at the entrance to Castlecomer Parish Church. Upon the pedestals are now placed bowls hewn from Kilkenny black marble.

The inscription on the white marble reads: *asperges me hyssop et mundabor (sprinkle me with hyssop and I shall be clean (from the Catholic Mass))* More next week.....

175 YEARS OF THE RAILWAY STATION

Mcdonagh Railway Station was opened on May 12^{th} 1848 and celebrates 175 years this week – it was named McDonagh Junction in 1966 after Thomas McDonagh one of the signatories of the 1916 Proclamation. McDonagh, a native of Tipperary, taught in St Kieran's College for one year in 1902 moving then to St Colman's College in Fermoy. He was a founding member of ASTI, the secondary teacher's trade union. The railway station was only 9 years in existence when St Mary's Cathedral was opened but played a significant part during the weekend of Oct 4th bringing huge crowds to Kilkenny for the dedication and consecration by Bishop Walsh.
