BECOME A FRIEND OF ST MARY'S CATHEDRAL

BAPTISMAL FONT AND AMBRY

The new baptismal font was installed in the Cathedral during Holy Week this year and was consecrated by Bishop Coll at the Easter Vigil.

During this past week the final element of the work begun in 2021 was installed. This is the AMBRY which will contain the Holy Oils.

The word Aumbry is a derivative through the French of the classical armarium, or medieval Latin almarium. Its original meaning was a cupboard and it has never lost this more general sense, but even in classical Latin it had acquired in addition the special signification of a cupboard for holding books. It was the word used to describe the tabernacle in medieval times but not in more recent time. The shelf is in the same stone as the altar, ambo and baptismal font: *Combe Brune* Limestone. It is honed and hence the texture and finish. The decorative screen was designed by Thomas Glendon. (Thomas also sculpted the altar, ambo and baptismal font). Vincent Byrne, Irish Church Metals Dublin, used the prepared design to manufacture the screen.

It is appropriate that the Holy Oils –Catechumens, Chrism and Oil of the Sick – be displayed in a convenient place near the baptismal font.

The Holy Oils are contained in three pewter jars which have been in use in the Cathedral for over a century – the type face of the inscription is Victoriana and suggests possible the time of the work of Bishop Brownrigg in the 1890s. The pewter jars and box were made by Donegan, 32 Dame Street, Dublin. The Donegan family were watch makers founded in Dublin in 1835 and moved to Dame Street around 1860 until 1924. This would further suggest the early date of the 1890s for the pewter containers. These jars will now be on display here and like much of our cathedral form a long and beautiful link with the generations who have gone before us. While it was considered to use new oil stocks using the original pewter containers maintains the link with the past and with the faith of all who have gone before us is very important.

We are all part of the living Church: those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith and who gifted us this beautiful church, those who will come after us and will care for the cathedral in their time, and those of us in the present who are called to the people of God at this time and to be part of the story that is
